

Elites in Latin America

Edited by SEYMOUR MARTIN LIPSET, Harvard University; and ALDO SOLARI.

Most governments in Latin America today are controlled by small elites or oligarchies, and much of the opposition to these governments comes from other elites. Thus to understand political, social, and economic processes in Latin America one must understand the elites. In this book fifteen social scientists from the United States and various parts of Latin America analyze those factors that condition the special character of these elites. While the essays focus mainly on the significant types of elite groups—political, working class, cultural, religious, peasant, military—much of the study is concerned with the ways in which the secondary and university systems affect the competence, orientation, and composition of future elites.

Democratic institutions had been maintained in Latin America's largest country for more than three decades before constitutional government in Brazil broke down in 1964. This book examines whether this breakdown of constitutional processes was inevitable. It is a thorough study of Brazilian politics, beginning with Getulio Vargas's fifteen-year rule. The author shows a keen awareness of how the difficulties of economic expansion, an unfavorable trade balance, inequitable land distribution, and shifting political power have hindered Brazil's growth and stability in this classic study of a nation in the throes of industrialization.
