## **Aboriginal Languages in Education**

*A collection of reports and issues papers describing how schools and Aboriginal communities are working together to preserve and maintain Aboriginal languages in their communities.*

Aboriginal languages exist today in a radically changed world: many of them are no longer spoken fluently and those that remain are widely felt to be under threat. In most places schools are the focus of efforts to keep languages going or to re-establish them. This ranges from schools where students speak English as a second language to city centres where languages are being revived from archival material as there are no surviving speakers.

As Aboriginal language programs in schools are still relatively new this book is ideal for teachers, linguists and those interested in setting up and running a language program in their community. *Aboriginal Languages in Education* contains ten articles describing different kinds of programs involving Aboriginal languages in school around Australia and seventeen articles covering different issues such as bilingual education, two-way education, curriculum development, programs in non-bilingual schools, assessing oral ability and training for Aboriginal language workers and teachers.

Highly recommended for anyone wanting information about Aboriginal language programs and related issues.
