THE conferences of this, the first national course of Phonology and Phoniasty, are designed firstly for physicians and otolaryngologists who may find special interest in diseases affecting voice and speech; and, secondly, for masters, professors and students of singing, for actors and orators, for whom we believe knowledge of the anatomy, physiology and pathology of the vocal organ is very useful. For this reason, the conferences dedicated to this last group will be elementary in character and illustrated with practical examples in order to bring about understanding of the best ways of using the vocal organ and of the care and preservation of the voice.

Daily, at 10 a.m., there will be examinations of patients and operations of the Specialty.

Registrations should be made in the Secretariat of the O.R.L. Service of the Faculty of Medicine. Fee 300 pesetas. For masters, pupils and professors of singing, 50 pesetas.

On Friday evening there will be a social meeting at supper for the professors and those attending the courses.


The Faculty of Medicine will provide a Diploma of Attendance at the Course. During the course films of relevant subjects will be shown.




