Typescript. Typescript, double-spaced, should be submitted (in triplicate) to Professor Merrilee Salmon, Department of History and Philosophy of Science, University of Pittsburgh, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania 15260 U.S.A. Typescripts will not be returned unless return postage is prepaid by cheque, money order, International Postal Reply Coupons or U.S. stamps. A bibliographical list of cited references beginning with the author's last name, initials, followed by the year of publication in parentheses, should be headed 'References' and placed on a separate sheet in alphabetical order. Simple citations should then be made by employing in the text, *rather than by footnote*, the reference list by citing author and year of publication, for example, Jones (1958) or (Smith 1974, p. 46). A detailed guide to the new reference style appears in the March issue of each year. Discursive footnotes should be numbered consecutively throughout the typescript. *An abstract (in triplicate) of approximately 100 words must accompany typescript. Typescript must not exceed 9,500 words, including abstract, footnotes and references. A word count must be submitted with each essay. Longer essays will be returned (at the author's expense) to be cut to the acceptable maximum.* All illustrations must be professionally drawn and lettered. All formulas and equations should be put in such a form as to help minimize the number of printed lines in the journal. In the following examples the form on the right is preferable to that on the left:
