# Hegel's Dialectic and its Criticism

MICHAEL ROSEN

Michael Rosen's challenging book argues that Hegel's philosophy does not draw upon a universal presuppositionless conception of rationality. Rather, Hegel's originality lies in founding his system upon a particular, avowedly mystical conception of philosophical experience – 'pure Thought'. Pure Thought makes speculative reasoning intelligible and, hence, underpins the claim to rationality. Dr Rosen's conclusion is that all attempts at rehabilitation of Hegel are based on misunderstanding, and that when restored to their speculative-mystical shell the kernel of Hegel's concepts becomes apparent.
