At a time when many libraries must take a close look at their budgets, can you and your students dispense with the ever fuller and faster services provided by *INTERNATIONAL POLITICAL SCIENCE ABSTRACTS*? A non-commercial journal published bimonthly by the International Political Science Association itself, the *Abstracts* provides summaries of articles in both specialized and non-specialized journals, including major yearbooks. Articles in English are abstracted in English; articles in other languages (approximately 30%) are abstracted in French, with all titles translated into English. From 1,450 abstracts in 1968 the progress has been to 5,133 abstracts in 1980. Each issue carries a detailed subject index and a list of the 600 periodicals examined; the final issue of each annual volume contains a cumulative subject index and an author index. *Back volumes are again available (from vol. 1, 1951).*

Your own Library should have a full set of the *Abstracts*. The institutional subscription for 1981 costs French Francs 575 (approximately \$ 135, £ st. 55). Individuals may subscribe at a reduced rate of F.F. 150 (approximately \$ 35, £ st. 14). Specimen on request.

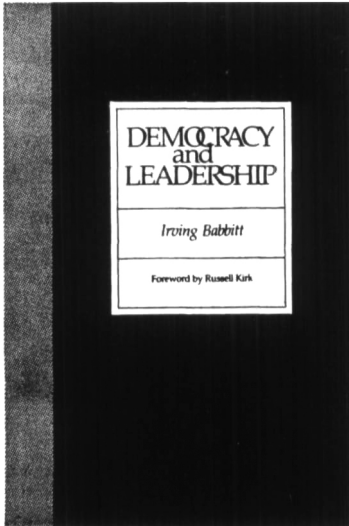
