BASIC COURSE IN PRACTICAL RHINOMANOMETRY

Rhinomanometry has received very little attention in this country and the time is ripe for a seminar devoted to the basic principles, available equipment and the value of the particular investigation. We have been fortunate in obtaining two leading authorities on this subject, including Professor Clement, who in addition to being Professor of Otolaryngology at the University of Brussels, is also Chairman of the international committee which is dealing with the standardization of rhinomanometry, and Dr Eccles, who has made a special study of nasal physiology.
